£2850	Dancing and movement to music Outside coach	To develop a range of movement skills. To link with classes themes.	All primary pupils	ASD low ability students will have the sensory diet tailored to during the sessions. ASD higher ability and MLD students have developed their knowledge and abilities of Dance. PMLD- have had opportunities to develop their range of movements. Primary staff teams have attended all sessions and therefore through observation developed their subject knowledge. Progress has been tracked through B Squared.

PMLD and Lower ability ASD pupils	Students have had their sensory needs matched. Students have further developed their expressive and receptive communication skills. Students have had increased opportunities to develop their fine and gross motor skills. There have been good cross curricular links with music.

£2000	Lifeguard assessor course	To train a members of staff to qualify as a lifeguard and keep upto date the training of the staff. To train more staff to be lifeguards. To allow access to the pool in absence of swim teacher	All pupils	8 qualified lifeguards across school. No cancelled swim sessions due to not having a lifeguard. Unfortunately swim assessor has now left school so expected impact is limited to this year.
£550	Sensory Equipment	To be able to offer a range equipment that can capture and engage students attention. To support all staff in the teaching of PE	PMLD and Lower Ability ASD students	Equipment engaged students. Equipment captured student's attention. Equipment supported staff in the teaching of PE.
£687	Outside play equipment	To be able to offer a range equipment that can capture and engage students attention during break times.	All Students in particular those who are difficult to engage	Equipment engaged students during break times. Equipment captured student's attention and made break times more active. Equipment supported the behaviour of students.
